Project Management Certification

- **What is PMP Certification?**

- The PMP acknowledges candidates skilled at managing the people, processes, and business priorities of professional projects.
- The PMP was created to recognize project managers who have proven they have project leadership experience and expertise.
- To obtain PMP certification, a project manager must meet certain requirements and then pass a 180-question exam.

- **PMP certification validates that you are highly skilled in:**

- Motivating people and teams through all phases of a successful project.
- Using predictive, agile and hybrid approaches to determine which way of working is best for each project.
- Highlighting the success of a project and its impact on overall strategic organizational goals.

Why Do It?

- Earn More – Median Salary for PMP holders is 32% higher in the US

 - Verifies that you have the background and have the necessary knowledge in Project Management

What is the criteria?

- A secondary degree (high school diploma, associate's degree, or global equivalent) **AND**
- 60 months leading projects **AND**
- 35 hours of formal project management education/training

OR

- A four-year degree (bachelor's degree or global equivalent) **AND**
- 36 months leading projects **AND**
- 35 hours of formal project management education/training

Other Requirements

1. Complete 35 hours of formal project management education/training.
2. Complete the application process.
3. Schedule to take the PMP examination.
4. Prepare for the PMP examination.
5. Pass the test.
